

# Syllabi That Pass The Test

## A cornerstone of accreditation at Webster University

## **Consistency Challenges**

Webster University had many of the same concerns about syllabus management that most institutions have, but at a massive scale both geographically and numerically. They wanted to be able to be able to monitor syllabus creation and revision across multiple campuses and have a central repository for syllabi. With 50+ campuses on four continents serving over 10,000 students, that alone was no small task.

The biggest challenge they faced, however, was creating consistency in their syllabi. The Accreditation Council for Business Schools and Programs (ACBSP) has strict standards for syllabus consistency that the university needed to meet. A highly mobile student population - including members of the armed forces who could be ordered to relocate at any time - required that every student receive the same syllabus experience in any course regardless of where it was delivered.

Both required making sure that all syllabi for the same course were up-to-date and consistent, no matter where the course was being taught or by whom. They also needed to limit faculty from modifying the content of certain portions of syllabi or changing the organization and presentation of the syllabus as a whole.

## **First Steps**

Webster began by developing an in-house system to address shortcomings in their process. A syllabus repository and template documents provided some structure and improvements. However, the system left much to be desired. The volume of syllabi created additional problems for storage and support for the IT department, and the lack of auditing and reporting capabilities made tracking syllabus creation and revisions from over 1,500 faculty members around the world nearly impossible for administrators. The in-house system also did not address any of the more urgent concerns about ensuring consistency.

#### **Enter Concourse**

Structured templates also created consistency in how the information was presented within the syllabus, providing a seamless experience for students across courses and exceeding accreditors' standards.

### **Lasting Impact**

Concourse improved all aspects of syllabus management for Webster. Beyond eliminating basic concerns about storage and support, the platform provided an intuitive interface for faculty and staff. Most importantly, tiered templates, granular control over editing, and robust reporting combined to provide an unmatched level of consistency in syllabi. ## **Above and Beyond**

Beyond those benefits, Concourse's robust reporting allowed administrators to rapidly assess the status of the huge volume of syllabi generated each semester. Content reports allowed administrators to detect missing or incomplete portions of syllabi and get faculty back on track to address those gaps. The ability to generate reports targeting select syllabus content across large swaths of syllabi also provided clear and focused information for their accrediting body, saving significant time over manual compilation of reports.
