Going Beyond Accreditation Recommendations

Syllabus Collection and Consistency Challenges

Syllabus management became a high priority for FMCC in 2006, when the institution was cited by their accreditor, Middle States, for lacking an assessment process to ensure consistency in the curriculum.

An accreditation review can be a nerve-wracking experience, and the Middle States site visit was no exception. FMCC faced the challenge and began the steps to conduct their re-accreditation process. Stepping up to the plate to lead the charge was their Academic Affairs and Provost's Office, and they were determined FMCC would be in compliance no matter the work involved.

Consistency was the overarching goal for FMCC, and like most community colleges, they employed a significant number of adjunct faculty. While the contributions of FMCC adjunct faculty were, and are still, invaluable to the institution, the part-time nature of the position created additional challenges for consistent syllabus management.

Filing Cabinets Take the Stage

It was all-hands on deck after the Middle States visit. FMCC got straight to work creating a process for collecting syllabi by hand or email. Administrators gathered all documents and recorded them on a spreadsheet to track who had or hadn't turned in their syllabus. Once collected, hard copies were shuffled into filing cabinets – where they sat, not once proving useful other than having been collected.

This low-tech, high effort, approach worked well enough as a baseline for knowing who had and had not turned in a syllabus, but FMCC knew it could do much better. It was ready to take the next step of reviewing syllabi for compliance, and doing so manually wasn't going to cut it. They needed something far more efficient that was centralized, searchable, and that allowed general access to the entire campus community. Building a system in-house was not in their plans, so it was time to look outside for help.
